WARF: Stepping Up as Supplemental Unemployment Ends

Since April, when the Covid-19 crisis led to the economic shutdown, WARF has been helping almost 200 families with housing, food, and child-care expenses. Although WARF's original mission has been achieved, as the state of emergency has continued, needs for funds also continue.

The attached infographic summarizes the successful activities of WARF over the past four months. Our volunteers have been working tirelessly to put your donation to meaningful use. While we are proud to have accomplished what we set out to do, we are all determined to support the community for a bit longer, especially families with students returning to school at this difficult time.
